

Course number amendments at the interface of UG and Grad programs

400-level (400-499): This tier of advanced undergraduate- courses. Graduate students are allowed to, and can receive graduate credit for these courses up to university policy limits. (additional limits may be set by specific graduate programs). This tier is also commonly applicable in coterminal degree programs. Four year undergraduate degrees generally have terminal highest level of expertise courses in the subject matter of the degree

500-level (500-599): These courses are designed for graduate students and postbaccalaureate professional-degree students. Advanced UG are allowed to take these classes for credit on a case by case basis (approval of AU and/or advisor?) Undergraduate program cannot require 500 level classes but can allow them as a panel of electives. This tier typically includes all coursework for the PhD degree.
